## Admission

Applicants must have successfully completed

- a bachelor degree, or higher, in tourism, travel, hospitality, event management, heritage, geography, social science, cultural studies, humanities, business, environmental management, or a related discipline; **OR**
- a bachelor degree, or higher, in any discipline **AND** a minimum of two years full-time equivalent work experience in roles related to tourism, travel, hospitality, event management and/or the visitor economy; **OR**
- a bachelor degree, or higher, in any discipline **AND** a minimum of five years full-time equivalent general work experience; **OR**
- an advanced diploma, or equivalent, in tourism, travel, hospitality, event management, heritage, geography, social science, cultural studies, humanities, business, environmental management, or a related discipline **AND** five years full-time equivalent work experience at a managerial or professional level in roles related to

tourism, travel, hospitality, event management, heritage and/or the visitor economy.

Applicants seeking admission on the basis of work experience must support their application with a Statement of Service for all work experience listed on the application.

## Recommended Sequence
