

# HLTH 1019 PARAMEDICINE FOUNDATIONS 2

**Description** In this Subject, students develop additional skills around patient assessment and the management of basic medical and trauma conditions. Students also learn to work in clinical teams in a range of environments and focus on the provision of person-centred care. Students continue to explore the role and context of paramedicine within the health system including existing and emerging paramedic practice environments. Students will have the opportunity to practice new and existing skills. Students become oriented to the out of hospital setting during clinical placements in the community preparing them for an emergency ambulance clinical placement in the following semester

## Learning Outcomes

1. Apply basic clinical decision making to introductory paramedic scenarios.
2. Utilise effective communication skills with the client, peers, health and academic staff and demonstrate person-centred practice
3. Explain and apply basic principles of assessment and management of medical and trauma conditions.
4. Interpret basic findings arising from patient assessment, physical examination and history taking.
5. Describe the process of recognising, preparing and checking common paramedic medications.
6. Engage in a range of practice environments safely as part of a paramedic team
7. Employ appropriate communication, person-centred care and professional practice in a community healthcare setting.

## Subject Content

1. Clinical assessment of the patient in an out of hospital environment
2. Basic management of medical and trauma conditions
3. Medication safety
4. Patient epidemiology
5. Introduction to paramedicine research
6. Basic applied decision making
7. Safe participation in a paramedic team in time-critical environments

Placements (spread across the semester) - Supervised, 3 days of placement with non-emergency patient transport ambulance crew

## Work integrated learning

The Paramedicine Program is working with placement partners to implement a range of resources to assist preceptors in WIL supervision. A structured framework of activities is available to preceptors to assist them in achieving learning outcomes.
