LAWS 2015 PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITY AND LEGAL ETHICS

Description This subject examines the nature of the legal profession and its role in society. It deals with the professional, legal and ethical responsibilities legal practitioners owe to the law, the courts, their clients and to fellow practitioners, as well as the state and society at large. Students will be able to explain and evaluate the law and practice of legal practitioners, by reference to key topics, such as: professionalism; legal ethics; the history, structure and regulation of the legal profession; and the interpersonal, psychological and cultural factors affecting lawyers. Guided by an ethical decision-making model, students will demonstrate their ability to use primary legal materials to answer legal ethical problems.

- Explain the necessity for legal practitioners to effectively and ethically communicate across cultures, particularly with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples

- 2. Professional Communication (including cultural understanding).
- 3. Duty to the Law, Courts and Fellow Practitioners.
- 4. Duty to Clients (including basic principles of trust accounting).
- 5. Admission, Professional Misconduct and Discipline.
- 6. Psychology and ethical decision making.
