# PERF 7008 MUSIC THERAPY THEORY & PRACTICE 2

Description This subject focuses on the delivery of music therapy to young adults, adults and older adults with various approaches and settings being explored across the semester. There is an emphasis on the role that music therapy plays in addressing the therapeutic goals of adult participants within settings including: community, medical, mental health, rehabilitation, and aged care. Verbal skills for music therapists and facilitating music therapy group work are also explored. The next steps in music therapy research are covered, with particular attention to conducting a systematic literature review. Students are guided in how to draw on evidence and examples from music therapy and related fields, through developing applied critical thinking skills and gathering knowledge in a systematic manner. Abstract writing and introduction to writing a research proposal is also included.

- 2. Apply knowledge focused on music therapy with young adults, adults, and older adults in relation to the standards of practice with this population group
- 3. Identify key considerations and methods in the delivery of music therapy to young adults, adults, and older adults across a range of settings
- 4. Conduct a systematic literature review focused on a specific area of diagnosis, with an application to either young adults, adults, or older adults
- 5. Identify and describe the Australian Music Therapy Association (AMTA) standards of practice and explain the purpose of the AMTA code of ethics at an intermediate level
- 6. Describe and explain the areas of verbal skills in relation to music therapy with young adults, adults, and older adults

## **Subject Content**

Topics covered within this subject may include:

- Adult Practice Focus: Connecting music and therapy in the adult context; Music therapy groups, concepts and applications; Principles of counselling, individuals and groups. Verbal skills in music therapy, musical styles in practice and case material.
- Adult Practice Settings: Music therapy applications for adults within community, medical, in-patient mental health, neurologic care and rehabilitation, aged care, home/residential, and clinic/studio/centre settings.
- Research Focus: Evidence based practice (EBP); Evidence based research (EBR); Undertaking a research project; Writing music therapy abstracts
